## MACHINERY FOR THE MILL IS ON ORDER

Reopening of Plant Under Duby  
Management Set for  
February 16.

E. F. Duby, manager of the  
Prince Rupert Lumber Co., stated  
this morning that as he had been  
assured a supply of power by the  
city officials he had placed the  
order for the machinery for the  
planing and lath mills and the  
gang saw was purchased two  
weeks ago.

Work will be commenced on  
the new units as soon as the  
material can be assembled. In  
the meantime construction will  
be commenced on the other ex-  
tensions, material for which is  
already on the ground.

Owing to the favorite change  
of weather, plans have been made  
to reopen the mill on February  
16, but this is subject to weather  
conditions being favorable. Un-  
less there is bad weather the saws  
should be buzzing next month and  
also the installation of the new  
plant should go on at the same  
time. This will help to keep the  
town lively and will be one of the  
harbingers of the busy summer  
that is expected.

### Sport Briefs

According to a London sport  
writer when Jack Dempsey meets  
Georges Carpentier for the world  
championship, he will have to  
fight two opponents. The writer  
claims that Carpentier's manager,  
Descamps, has a mystic eye and  
when at the ring side exerts a  
hypnotic influence over the  
Frenchman's rival. He attributes  
the defeat of Joe Beckett recently  
to this supernatural influence of  
Descamps. Had Beckett been  
fighting Carpentier alone he would  
have won easily. It is predicted  
that Carpentier will win in six  
rounds with Dempsey.

Dai Thomas, famous Welsh  
international soccer player, and  
former champion sprinter of Eng-  
land, has located in Vancouver.  
As a football player Thomas has  
a great record. At 16 years of  
age he captained the Aberaman  
team which won the Welsh Cup  
in 1899. He held the scoring  
record every season while in  
Welsh football and due to his re-  
markable speed and unswerving  
ability he was considered nigh  
impossible to tackle. He also  
holds the world's scoring record  
for which he received a medal in  
1907 from the old country foot-  
ball union. Holding also a cham-  
pion sprinter's record, Vancouver  
sportsmen think that he should  
be of invaluable assistance to the  
budding athletes of that city if his  
services can be obtained.

Bobby McLean, the champion  
skater of the world, is now on his  
way to Christiania to defend his  
title in a series of races with  
Oscar Matheison, the European  
champion. Bobby McLean is 25  
years of age and was born at  
Chicago, Illinois. In 1917 he  
joined the United States air ser-  
vice and for two years has done  
no skating. He has participated  
in 1,500 races and makes \$10,000  
a year, much of which he puts by.  
It is said he has won so many  
medals that he cannot pin them  
on his chest.

The Gilhuly Cigar Store Basket  
ball Cup for the winner of the  
Senior League Series arrived in  
town on Thursday and is now on  
exhibition in the window of the  
store. It is a beautifully engraved  
trophy with foliage and signifi-  
cant designs and stands 18 inches  
high, mounted on its ebony base.  
It will indeed be a worthy trophy  
for the season. The following is
