LIQUOR DRIFTS IN BUT LEAVES AGAIN

Very Valuable Cargo of Spirits
Reaches New York But
Is Not Seized.

NEW YORK, Feb. 5.—Liquor valued at \$4,500,000 aboard the steamship Yarmouth was forced into New York harbor because of a leak in the ship. The vessel will not be seized, according to a decision after consultation between the United States district agent and prohibition enforcement agents.

The Yarmouth will proceed to Havana.
