Terrace Bridge.

8 Strong and forcible representation was made by your delegation for the construction of the Terrace bridge with a view to opening up some 100,000 acres of good timber, agricultural and horticultural land in the Lakelse WANTED-Woman cook or help-Valley, and many of the ministers were privately interviewed with a view to obtaining their individual support. 
