## ALICE ARM MINE BONDED

David Copperfield, Advancing the Dolly Varden, Under \$200,000 Bond to Toronto Interests.

ALICE ARM, B.C., Feb. 11.—The David Copperfield mine, which joins the Dolly Varden on the south and abuts directly on the railroad, has been bonded to Watt & Watt, of Toronto, for the sum of \$200,000 with a cash payment down of \$2,000. The David Copperfield is the property of the original discoverers, R. F. McGinnis, Wm. McLean and A. E. Wright, surveyor of Prince Rupert.

During the past winter the David Copperfield has been a much sought after property, a Seattle firm having been making negotiations for some months past. The American people finally made their arrangements and sent their agreement to the owners just a day or so before the deal had been signed up with the Toronto interests. Extensive development work will be started on the property at once.

## BASKETBALL GAME WAS DISQUALIFIED

Sons of England Win but Have Only Two Registered Players.

Though it will probably be disqualified in the Senior basketball series, the game played last night in the rink between the Sons of England and the Travelers was a good fast exhibition. ## FOREST RANGERS

An examination for Rangers in the Forest Branch of the Department will be held in the Court House, Prince Rupert, on March 3rd, 1920.

The examination will be partly written and partly oral. The questions will be mainly on logging, cruising, surveying, forest protection, etc., but will also test candidates' ability to prepare reports. Physical ability and good character are absolute requirements.

Candidates must be British Subjects, resident in Canada for at least one year and not more than 50 years of age.

Returned soldiers, with the necessary qualifications will receive preference.

Applications to take examination will be received up to the day of examination by the District Forester, Prince Rupert, from whom application forms may be obtained.

All statements made by applicants as to experience, education, and fitness are subject to verification by Examination Board.
