On Wednesday G. S. Hanes of North Vancouver, a former supporter of the Government, revived charges of graft in connection with the construction of the Pa-I cific Great Eastern Railway. Mr. Hanes did not make any marked impression.

On Thursday Frank Giolma, soldier member for Victoria, capped the climax with a demand for the immediate resignation of the Government. He made no material progress and probably did not expect to do so. The burden of his plea was that while the administration had made a good showing in dealing with the problems facing it when the late H. C. Brewster came into power in 1916, still conditions had now so greatly changed that it was improper to proceed without a new mandate from the people. It is the belief here that Pre-1 mier Oliver has no intention of going to the country at present.
