OTTAWA, Feb. 20.-Ratification of the Grand Trunk agreement by the shareholders in London will be followed by the appointment of a committee of mancourt or on the premises, Mr. agement. The committee will be composed of five persons, two appointed by the Grand Trunk, two by the Government and the fifth by the other four.

The committee of management will endeavor to ensure the operation of the Grand Trunk system in harmony with the Canadian National Railways, the two systems being treated as nearly as possible as one.
