GERMAN CHILDREN BADLY NOURISHED, SAYS A PROFESSOR

(Special via G. T. P. Telegraphs.) BERLIN, Feb. 23.—Two million babies would have been born in Germany between 1914 and 1918 if the war had not occurred, according to professor Emil Abderhalden, professor of physiology in Westphalen University, speaking on infant mortality.

Prof. Abderhalden declared that malnutrition, from which half a million children were suffering, threatened the lives of 100,000 of them.
