Liquor Interests  
Busy at Ottawa.

The liquor interests are busy at Ottawa trying to undo the legislation which was passed at the last session of the Dominion Parliament, giving the provinces the right to pass bone dry legislation. Now they are asking that instead of a majority vote, they shall require a three-fifths vote in order to make it effective.

In order to get rid of the responsibility it is said that the Dominion Government will not make it a party question but will leave each member to vote as he sees fit.

Bolsheviks Win  
Recent Election.

According to reports received the Bolsheviks have swept Russia in the recent elections. We do not know under what condition the elections are held, nor who is allowed to exercise the franchise, but judging from early reports it seems that anyone likely to vote against the Lenin Government is disfranchised. That is the same thing that the Union Government in this country was charged with doing, only in a much more drastic form. It will be interesting to learn more details before accepting the face value of the vote.

Farmers Propose  
Entering Politics.

The farmers movement in Ontario proved popular and on the prairies it is likely to be acceptable to the majority of the voters, but in British Columbia things are different. In the first place there are fewer farmers here in comparison to the total population, than in the other provinces. Here, too, the Oriental question is one that is a vital one and the farmers have in many districts come out strongly in favor of admitting Chinese laborers to work on the farms and help clear the land. Some have suggested that indentured labor be introduced. How would the labor unions look on such a proposal?

Farmers in this province are usually protectionists. They want the product of their orchards protected against dumping from Washington. The labor interests are generally for free trade, or as free trade as it is possible to secure under present conditions. These two differences alone will be stumbling blocks to the success of the farmers' movement.

Ireland Still in  
Parlous Condition.

There seems to be no such thing as reconciliation in Ireland. While part of the population is crying for the cutting away altogether from England and Scotland, the other section is holding on firmly for close union with Great Britain.

No one seems to know what the outcome will be. There is a Home Rule bill in prospect which a few years ago would have been acceptable with alacrity but which today finds no favor in the Emerald Isle. It would be a wise prophet who could tell with any degree of certainty what the future holds.

Providing for  
Women Prisoners.

The decision of the City Council to provide an addition as a lockup which can, when necessary, be used to house women prisoners, is one that must meet with approval. It had become a public scandal for women to be in the same prison with men. Recently an arrangement had been made with the Salvation Army to care for women prisoners, but it was not to be expected that this could continue. There had to be provision made sooner or later and the City Council has recognized this and done its duty in regard to the matter.

## FOREST RANGERS

An examination for Rangers in the Forest Branch of the Lands Department will be held in the Court House, Prince Rupert, on March 3rd, 1920.

The examination will be partly written and partly oral. The questions will be mainly on logging, cruising, surveying, forest protection, etc., but will also test candidates' ability to prepare reports. Physical ability and good character are absolute requirements.

Candidates must be British Subjects, resident in Canada for at least one year and not more than 50 years of age.

Initial salary \$1,500.00 per annum.

Returned soldiers, with the necessary qualifications, will receive preference.

Applications to take examination will be received up to the day of examination by the District Forester, Prince Rupert, from whom application forms may be obtained.

All statements made by applicants as to experience, education and fitness are subject to verification by Examination Board.
