

Orchestra Concert Sunday Evening.

Once more the local Symphony Orchestra is to give a Sunday night concert in the Westholme Theatre and doubtless many people will want to hear them. As the winter season is coming to a close soon there will not be many more opportunities to hear this fine aggregation of instrumentalists.

As with former concerts this one will be free by ticket. The idea of giving away tickets being that people who wish to attend church may do so feeling sure that they will get seats at the concert, if they have taken the trouble to secure their tickets, beforehand.
