GRAND OPENING SMITHERS HALL

There Were 350 Persons Gathered From East and West to Enjoy Dance.

The grand opening of the new town hall at Smithers on Monday night was an epoch-making event in the history of that town. Such a hall has been a long-felt need but when the people of Smithers started they put up a building which will be a credit to the town and of ample size to accommodate the largest crowds for many years. The cost of erecting the commodious and well appointed two-storey building were all covered by local subscription. It is a plastered hall and is articially lighted with a Delco system. The people of Smithers pride themselves on it as it is probably the largest and best dance hall west of Edmonton.

Great Gathering

At the opening on Monday night visitors flocked to Smithers from points along the railroad as far east as Burns Lake and from Terrace on the west. There were 350 persons present at the dance and the hall was by no means overtaxed. Practically all the younger people of Hazelton, Telkwa and Smithers were in attendance. The floor proved to be excellent and music by Gray's orchestra, consisting of J. S. Gray, Wm. Doodson and James Adams, was of a high quality. The collection taken was considered highly satisfactory by the management. J. E. Kirby and W. S. Gale acted as floor managers and had general supervision over the entire arrangements. Excellent refreshments were served during the course of the evening. Early in the morning the guests left with the remembrance of one of the most enjoyable evenings spent in the interior country.

Picture Shows.

Now that the hall is opened the next few weeks are well booked up and it is proposed in a short time to put in a regular motion picture show. Besides being useful as a show house and dance hall the place will be used for all inanner of public gatherings. The upstairs portion is well appointed with clubrooms and dressing rooms.
