The judge was especially impressed with the work going on at the Prince Rupert Spruce Mills and the Cold Storage plant which were visited in the morning. He left the city convinced of its prosperity and progress and hopes to pay another visit to the district when the full activity of the summer is on-

Judge Robson, who recently resigned from the arduous duties connected with the chairmanship of the Board of Commerce, was asked as to the economic situation of Canada today. "This is a very hand question to speak upon," he said. "The high prices will not come down till the production of manufactured articles exceeds the demand. This country, especially Western Canada, is a progressive country and for that reason the demands are very great and it is a hard thing for production to catch up. The demand, despite the high costs, shows a healthy economic condition in the country."


