Letters to Editor Must be Signed.

It is difficult to make correspondents understand that letters to the editor must be signed. We have a letter signed "Albertan" which we would publish if we knew who wrote it and the letter is being held in case the writer would care to send in his signature. No anonymous letters can ever be used.

The News welcomes correspondence on subjects of general interest and is willing to publish under a nom de plume, but the writer must always enclose his own name as a matter of good faith. No letters of a spiteful tone or written with the object of "getting back at" someone will be used. Very often readers are able to shed light on a subject which would be of great interest to other readers. On the other hand, people often write to the papers when they really have nothing particular to say.

German Revolution Somewhat of Surprise.

In view of the scarcity of news in regard to the German revolution it is difficult to discuss the matter. The move came as a surprise to most people, for the general opinion seems to have been that the new German Government had affairs well in hand. It is to be hoped that no drastic action will be taken by the reactionaries, which will necessitate a renewal of military activities in that country. It is also to be hoped that the Allies will be very firm in demanding that the letter and spirit of the treaty be lived up to.

Educational Films At the Movies.

There is a movement afoot in the East to have more educational films shown at the movies. In Prince Rupert we are usually well supplied with films of this kind for there is a demand for them. The series of outing pictures shown at the Westholme have been most interesting, and many people have gone to the show just for the purpose of seeing the outing films. At different times industrial films have attracted attention and the news pictures keep everyone in touch with actual happenings in different parts of the world.

The Canadian Municipal Journal is advocating that all licenses issued to picture houses should be conditional on an educational film being run at each show. That might be hard on the movie managers, but it is a good thing to insist on a goodly number of wholesome educational pictures. It is a matter for congratulation that the local management is already in line with a movement which is being advocated in the East.

Large Families and Enjoying Life.

There is an idea all too prevalent that to enjoy life it is necessary to live a life of ease. In some parts of Canada they have different notions. In Quebec, for instance, long families are much esteemed. Two candidates for the mayoralty in Quebec City at the recent election were the fathers of twenty-four and twenty-two children respectively. Here a family of from five to eight is looked on as a burden by everyone except the parents. To have a mayor with 22 children, as Quebec now has, is certainly an honor. It is to be hoped that the parents are well to do, for they could easily expend a little fortune in purchasing the necessities of life for the youngsters. If they came to Prince Rupert it would cost \$5.50 to get their shoes shined once, unless a wholesale rate could be secured.
