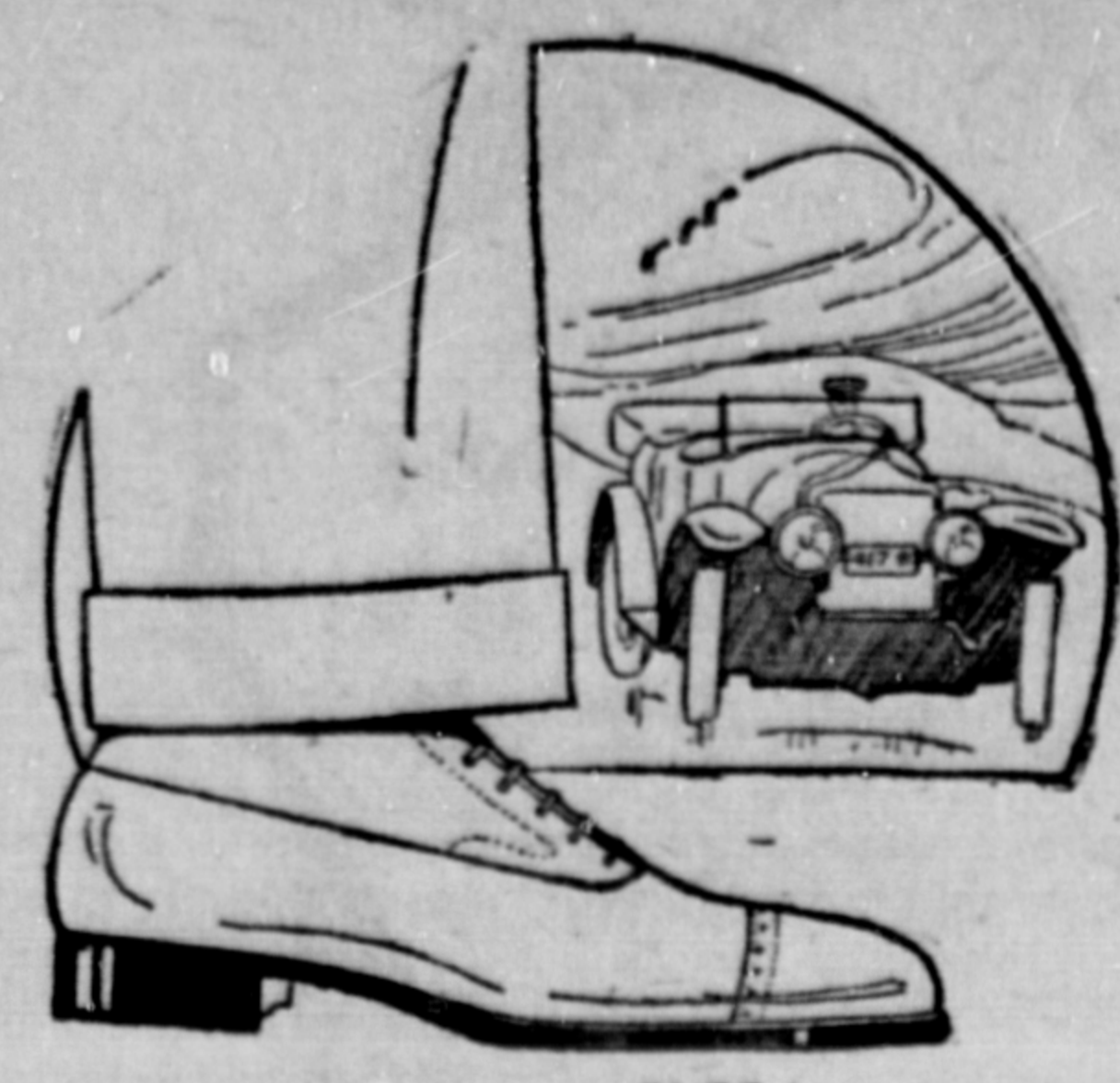

FUNERAL TUESDAY

Last Rites for Late Bert Green Will Take Place Under the Auspices of K. of P.

Under the auspices of the Knights of Pythias the funeral of the late Bert Green will take place tomorrow afternoon at 2:30 from the Presbyterian Church, Rev. Dr. Grant officiating at the church and the Knights conducting the service at the grave.

The late Mr. Green came to Prince Rupert in 1911 and worked in the Grand Trunk Pacific machine shops. He transferred to Smithers and in 1915, when the call was sent out for mechanics to work in England, Bert volunteered and was doing naval work with Camil Laird until early in last year. He had been back 11 months, during which time he worked for H. R. Love at the Imperial Machine Works.

Mr. Green came to Canada from Shotton, Flintshire, North Wales, and would have been 39 years of age had he lived until June next. He was married and had two children.

The death occurred yesterday morning of "Barney," the faithful attendant of A. C. Little. For ten years or more the familiar woolly haired figure has been well known in this city and has commanded the admiration and respect of everyone. Great War Veterans and All Stars Were Evenly Matched in Saturday's Game.

The football game between the All Stars and the Great War Veterans' Association in answer to the challenge sent out by the returned men resulted in a scoreless tie on Saturday afternoon. The ball was kicked off by Mayor McClymont and during the first half the soldiers seemed to have the best of it and played some good combination which put their opponents in corners at times. They failed to score at the last moments, however.

The Stars picked up in the second half when they had the wind, sun and slope in their favor. A goal was netted by them just before the final whistle but the referee called off side so it did not tally.

A characteristic of the entire game was a lack of effective forward work with the result that one man generally found himself alone forward with the ball, faced by a group of opponents. Good half and full back work was done. Bert Wearmouth, Percy Tinker and Albert Craggs starred for the Veterans while the most effective work for the All Stars was done by Sid. Hardy, Kelsey and Harry Menzies. Abe Kinghorn, with the Stars, showed his usual good form. Harry Day, playing half back, a new position for him, did not get an opportunity to do his familiar good work.

W. E. Willisroff refereed the game in excellent style and "crabbing" on the side lines was practically absent. J. Day Bell and Billie Reid were the linesmen.
