The current number of the British Columbia Gazette contains a notice of incorporation of the Central Interior Printing Co., capital \$10,000, with head offices at Prince George.

F. W. Graham, storekeeper for the Taylor Engineering Co. at Alice Arm, returned to the Arm by the Venture yesterday afternoon after having spent several months holidaying at his ranch at Smithers.

The game between the Callies and the Sons of Canada held tonight should be an interesting one. The Callies and Sons have been pretty well matched right through the basketball season.

The G. W. V. A. football committee wish to thank Mr. Peter Black, Central Hotel, for donating expenses incurred for printing, also all others who assisted in making the Memorial Fund football game a success.

Thomas Adams, town planning expert, whose remarks about Prince Rupert have often been resented here, is to lecture to the Women's Canadian Club at Vancouver tomorrow. He will also address a number of other organizations while on the coast.

One of the latest companies to be organized on this coast is the Portland Canal Maritime Co., Ltd., a private concern with \$25,000 capital with head office at Prince Rupert. It has powers to run steamships, reclaim lands, buy and sell properties and do a general trading business.

A letter of thanks was read at last night's council meeting from C. V. Evitt, commissioner of the Board of Trade, for the \$900 grant recently made that organization.

A wire was sent yesterday by the city to the city engineer at Vancouver asking what had happened to the rock samples for city street work that had been sent down some months ago for examination.

Building loans of \$2,500 each by the Housing Scheme Committee have been transferred from George Doughty and Hugh Killen to R. P. Linzey and C. V. Evitt respectively, by the decision of the council last night.

Violet Pittentre appeared in the police court this morning charged with creating a disturbance when drunk. Violet claimed she did not create a disturbance but was fined twenty dollars with the option of thirty days' imprisonment.

Mr. and Mrs. W. C. Norrie-Lowenthal arrived in town from the south on the Venture yesterday afternoon on their way to Hazelton where Mr. Norrie-Lowenthal is engineer in charge of the Silver Standard mine. Their little son accompanies them.

Hon. C. C. Ballantyne, minister of marine and fisheries at Ottawa, has replied to the city's communication regarding Capt. McCoskrie's letter setting forth Rupert's advantages as a naval base. The minister promises to give Prince Rupert due consideration when the time arrives.

George Dobbys was charged in the police court this morning with stealing goods or merchandise from the Grand Trunk Pacific Steamship Co., to wit, 7 teaspoons, 2 dessert spoons and 5 single towels, valued at \$5, on or about April 15, 1919. The offence being an indictable one the accused did not plead. Adjournment was made until 10 o'clock Thursday morning.

At last night's council meeting Alderman Casey suggested to Mayor McClymont that it was time he was getting busy and consulting with the Municipal Inspector in regard to the work the city was going to do this year and the way it was going to be paid for if a new scheme was to be worked out. The mayor thanked Alderman Casey for the advice but stated that he had let this stand over till the officials at Victoria were not quite so busy in connection with parliamentary duties.

A resolution from the Duncan Consolidated School Board urging a proportionate grant from the Provincial Government to school boards for teachers in municipalities instead of the per capita system was read at last night's council meeting. It is thought this would be in the better interests of efficient teaching and the Island board asked the support of other cities in the province. The matter was laid over for a week and is meantime being referred to the school board for report.
