WESTMINSTER PROTEST AGAINST REGULATIONS REGARDING FISHERIES

A resolution of protest against
the alleged determination of the
Dominion minister of marine and
fisheries to put the 1920 regula-
tions into force against the ex-
pressed wishes of so many inter-
ested fishermen and their asso-
ciates, was passed at the special
meeting of the Board of Trade
held in New Westminster at the
week-end.

President W. W. MacCall was
in the chair and a large attend-
ance of members was present as
well as members of the G. W. V.
A. A. and N. Veterans and dele-
gates from the Fishermen's Union.
The meeting was also anxious to
know just who constituted the in-
terests mentioned by the mem-
bers as being instrumental in the
framing of the 1920 regulations.
