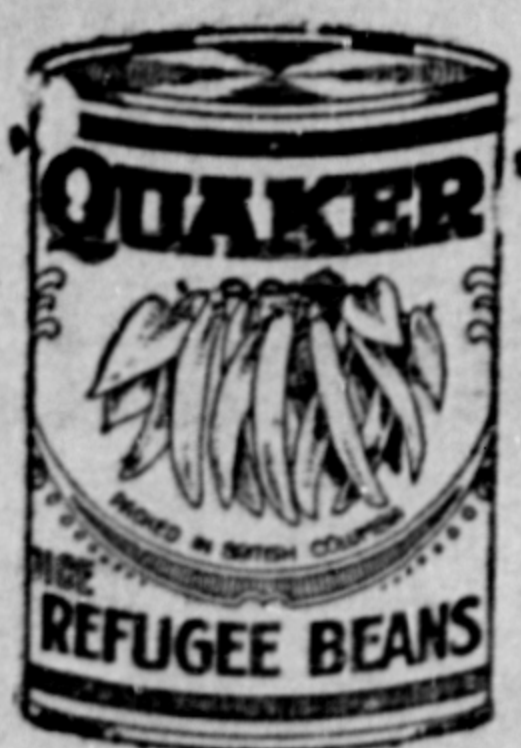

MRS. THOMAS DUNN DIES IN SAN DIEGO

Was Well Known and Respected
Resident of Prince Rupert in Pioneer Days.

The death took place in San Diego on Thursday of Mrs. Thos. Dunn, wife of the late Thomas Dunn, a pioneer hardware merchant of this city. Coming to Prince Rupert before the first sale of lots in 1909, Mrs. Dunn was one of the best known and most highly respected of early citizens. The family lived for many years at the corner of Second Avenue and Seventh Street. Two years ago Mr. Dunn died in the south. Mrs. Dunn was born in Toronto and was about 60 years of age. The funeral will be held in San Diego.

With the exception of Hugh Dunn, who is in Vancouver, all the family are living in California. The sons there are Nelson, Earl and Arnold and the daughters, Mrs. W. H. Ferguson, the Misses Helen, Dudsie and Elsie.

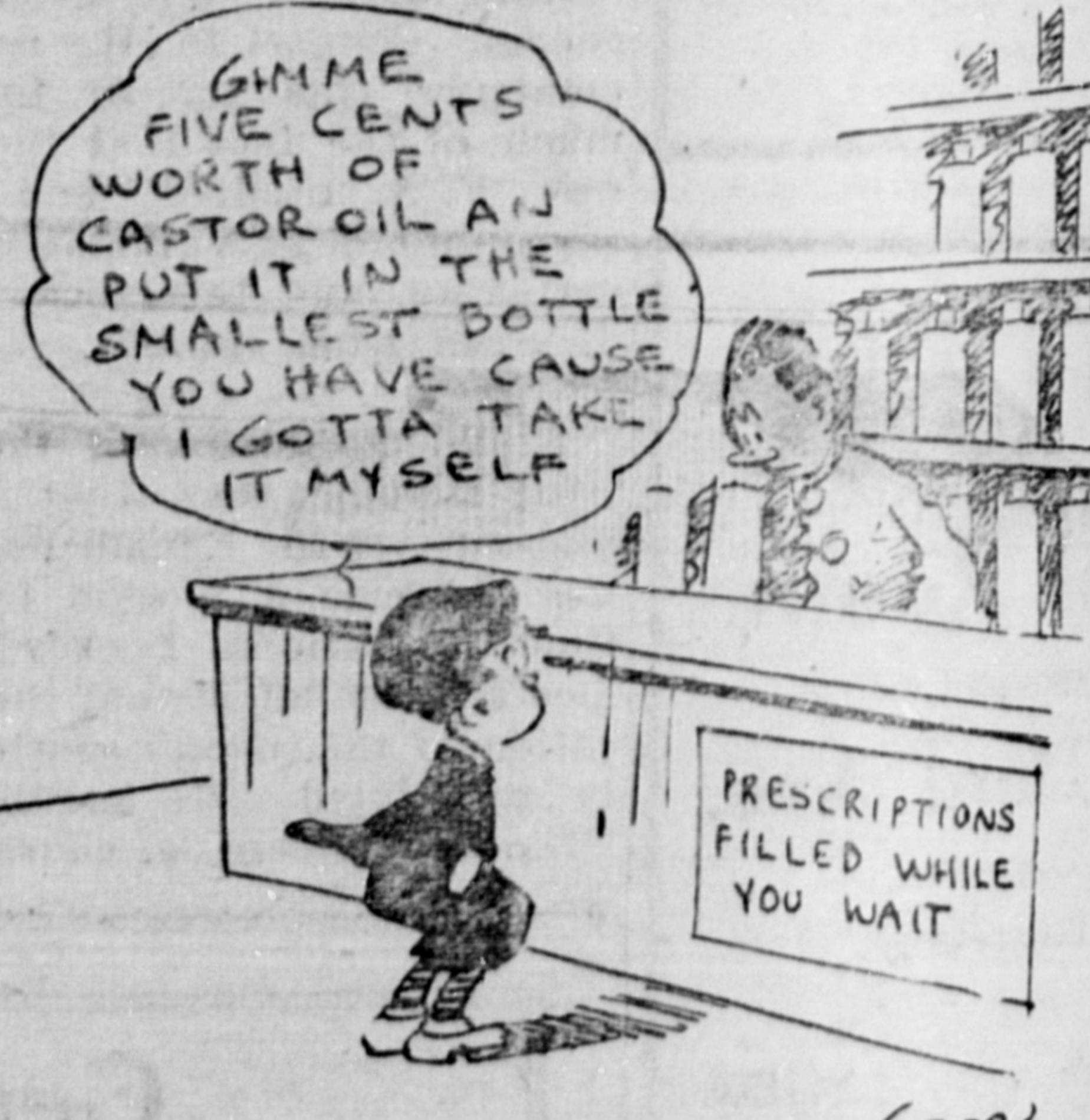
