LAST EVENING**

Much Excellent Talent Displayed at Callics Football Club Recital.

The Orchestra.

The first part of the program was concluded with a vocal solo "Thistle, Shamrock and Rose" by Wm. Murray which was loudly applauded.

Pipe Band.

The selections of the pipe band opening the second part, brought forth the usual applause. The pipe band is certainly creating a great impression. J. E. Davey was in his usual excellent style in singing "Mary of Argyle" and an encore. Mrs. W. Millar again pleased the listeners with "Angus Macdonald" which she does full justice to. Jack Sinclair sang the old favorite "Annie Laurie" and was well appreciated. Mrs. Captain and Miss Susie Reid proved excellent duettistes in "Whispering Hope" answered by "Lullaby Land." Miss Edmands sang "I hear you Calling Me" and "My Brown Rose" and A. Clapperton a selected solo. Ed. Ross sang a couple of comic songs in excellent style. After the concert the hall was cleared and the dancers took the floor and danced till the small hours to the strains of the society orchestra.

**MAGISTRATE ADVISES
MAN WHO COMMITTED
ASSAULT ON HIS WIFE**

Henry John Clarke, charged with assaulting his wife, was released on suspended sentence this morning after receiving a reprimand from Magistrate McMordie.

"There is no doubt," said the magistrate, "that you are suffering both physically and mentally from the effects of the war and the serious wounds you sustained. However, there is no excuse in this country for treating your wife violently, which you have done. Such actions as yours towards the woman were both cowardly and brutal. Do you not remember the promises you made when marrying her? They were made for better or for worse whether you had provocation or not. If it was not for the fact that it would be working a hardship on your wife I would most certainly send you to jail. As it is I am going to let you out on suspended sentence to give you a chance. Remember you must work for her and take care of her and must never lift your hand to her."

You are also to inform you that the fee for the second six months has not yet been paid, but it does not come due until the 18th May, 1921. The required amount is \$20.00 and I enclose herewith a letter referring to the patent by date and containing the purpose for which the remittance is required and that which will be necessary.
