The net earnings of the Canadian Government steamship services for 1919 were \$1,406,600 and the gross earnings during the same time \$3,448,036. This will provide interest at the rate of five and a half per cent on the Government investment. This was the pith of a lengthy speech made in the House of Commons on the subject by Hon. C. C. J. Hancock, who is interested in it, says that there is the making of a mine in the property and contemplates exploring and developing it this season. The prospect was located by D. W. Bone and J. C. McNicholls.

Swanson Bay has not heretofore been known as a mining possibility but the present discovery is said to look promising for development.
