B. C. INDIANS IN THE EAST

a representative of The Globe that Indians in British Columbia were being constantly imprisoned for catching salmon in the streams on their own reserves.

The delegation will demand that the fishing, hunting and water rights of the Indian tribes be fully adjusted. It is not intended to discuss the matter of fishing for commercial purposes, but the Indians claim that they have a clear aboriginal right to take salmon for food. The claim that the treaty regulations cannot be applied to the Indian tribes and that any attempt to enforce those regulations against the Indians is unlawful.

Claim Compensation.

Compensation is claimed for inequalities of acreage or value, inferior quality of reserved lands, damage caused to timber and other natural resources, for all moneys expended by tribes in the land controversy. Also that general compensation for lands to be surrendered be made, by establishing and maintaining an adequate system of education, including day and industrial schools and medical aid and hospitals.

If the Government accepts the proposed basis of settlement of the allied tribes and desires to enter into negotiations the Indians are willing to accept any equitable adjustment, but they declare that they are not prepared to accept any settlement by compromise.

Not Hopeful About Ottawa.

Discussing the prospects of the Indians' case, the leader of the delegation stated that the present Government of British Columbia had expressed its willingness to consider the basis of settlement, but he was not so sure of an equally open-minded attitude on the part of the Government at Ottawa. It seems that the attitudes of the two Governments have been reversed in recent years. Hitherto the British Columbia Government has been entirely opposed to the claims of the Indians, while the Federal au-

thorities used to favor their demands.

The delegation held an informal conference with members of the Indian Affairs Committee of the National Social Service Council, who promised to give the whole matter their best consideration at a full meeting of the committee.

Sport Briefs

There were half a dozen young fellows on the Prince Albert bound for Stewart yesterday who will form the nucleus of a baseball team at the mining camp. During their two days' stay here they were met by a number of Rupert fans and they say that they were likely looking lads. This is just an indication of the fact that there will likely be some good baseball teams in the north this season and there will probably be plenty of competition with Prince Rupert when the season opens up. Several Vancouver amateurs will likely find their way to various places in the district and they will be found on the line-ups of the various northern teams.

It has been decided by the executive committee of the Canadian Association of Amateur Oarsmen to bring forward the date of the Royal Canadian Henley next summer from Friday and Saturday, July 30 and 31, to Friday and Saturday, July 23 and 24. Since the original dates were fixed, the association was officially informed that the International Olympic Regatta which will commence on August 20 instead of September 24. The Canadian association found it necessary to advance the St. Catharines regatta otherwise there would not have been sufficient time left for the Canadian oarsmen to reach the Olympic course and make preparations for the races in which they will participate.

Amazing scenes of soccer football enthusiasm attended the last round of English cup games. In the 16 matches a total of 514,000 people were in attendance and the total gate receipts footed \$195,000. At the Chelsea versus Swindon match the receipts were \$25,300, a record outside the actual final. This is the big soccer event in England. A total of 63 clubs qualified for the competition proper. Games are played every two weeks, the losers dropping out until two remain who will play the final in London, April 24.

According to Al Lippe, the American manager of boxers, Georges Carpentier has signed with Theodore Vienne and Leon See, two French promoters, to box Jack Dempsey for a guarantee of \$100,000. He feels confident that the fight will be staged in Paris next December. A purse of \$200,000 and the motion picture rights have been granted to

Dominion of Canada

Your Income Tax Return Should be Filed at Once!!

All persons residing in Canada, employed in Canada, or carrying on business in Canada, are liable to a tax on income, as follows:

Every unmarried person, or widow, or widower, without dependents as defined by the Act, who during calendar year, 1919, received or earned \$1,000 or more.

All other individuals, who during calendar year received or earned \$2,000 or more.

Every corporation and joint stock company, whose profits exceeded \$2,000 during the fiscal year ended in 1919.

CLASS 1

Forms to be used in filing returns on or before the 31st of March, 1920.

Trustees, executors, administrators, agents and assignees must use Form T 3.

Employers making a return of the names and amounts paid to all directors, officials, agents or other employees must use Form T 4.

Corporations and Joint Stock companies making a return of all dividends and bonuses paid to shareholders and members during 1919, must use Form T 5.

NOTE—Individuals comprising partnership must file returns in their individual capacity on Form T 1 or T 1 A.

PENALTY

Every person who is required to make this return, who fails to do so within the time limited, shall be subject to a penalty of \$10.00 for each day during which the default continues—and all such penalties shall be assessed and collected from the person liable to make the return in the same manner in which taxes are assessed and collected.

Time Limit

All persons in Class 1, as shown hereon, must file on or before the 31st of March, 1920.

All persons in Class 2, as shown hereon, must file on or before the 30th of April, 1920.

General Instructions

Obtain Forms from the Inspectors or Assistant Inspectors of Taxation, or from Postmasters.

Read carefully all instructions on Form before filling it in.

Pre-pay postage on letters and documents forwarded by mail to Inspectors of Taxation.

Make your returns promptly, and avoid penalties

CLASS 2

Forms to be used in filing returns on or before the 30th of April, 1920:

All individuals other than farmers and ranchers must use Form T 1.

Farmers and ranchers must use Form T 1 A.

Corporations and Joint Stock companies must use Form T 2.

PENALTY

Every person required to make a return, who fails to do so within the time limited, shall be subject to a penalty of twenty-five per centum of the amount of the tax payable.

Any person, whether taxable or otherwise, who fails to make a return or provide information duly required according to the provisions of the Act, shall be liable on summary conviction to a penalty of \$100.00 for each day during which the default continues. Also that any person making a false statement in any return or in any information required by the Minister, shall be liable, on summary conviction, to a penalty not exceeding \$10,000, or to six months' imprisonment or to both fine and imprisonment.
