All persons residing in Canada, employed in Canada, or carrying on business in Canada, are liable to a tax on income, as follows:

Every unmarried person, or widow, or widower, without dependents as defined by the Act, who during calendar year, 1919, received or earned \$1,000 or more.

CLASS 1

Forms to be used in filing returns on or before the 31st of March, 1920. Trustees, executors, adminstrators, agents and

assignees must use Form Employers making a return of the names and amounts paid to all directors, officials, agents or

other employees must use Form T 4. Corporations and Joint Stock companies making a return of all dividends and bonuses paid to shareholders and members during 1919, must use Form T 5. NOTE.—Individuals comprising part-nership must file returns in their indivi-dual capacity on Form T 1 or T 1 A.
