## CAPT. BARNEY JOHNSON HAS GONE TO ENGLAND TO FETCH 2 WHALERS

Two 14-knot steel whalers, fitted with all the most modern devices of the industry, have been purchased in England by the Victoria Whaling Company, of which Captain B. L. Johnson is managing director, and will be brought to this coast this spring, says the Vancouver Province. Capt. Johnson is leaving on Thursday next for England to take over the ships and deliver them at Victoria. The vessels are new and will cost approximately \$75,000 each. They are 125 feet long and very strongly engined.

The company is building a station on Barclay Sound and expect to be operating by June. Preference will be shown returned men in employment.

Captain Johnson's resignation from the position of superintendent of the British Columbia pilotage district took effect today, and Captain Charles Eddie has taken temporary charge, pending the order from Ottawa creating free pilotage on this coast, as reported in The Province on Saturday.

## Sport Briefs

The fight at the Westholme on Wednesday night was really good. Not one of the large number of boxing enthusiasts who saw it had anything else to say. Many know-it-alls said that there would be nothing to it but the forecasts of the wiser ones that Chet Neff and Harry Anderson were evenly matched was fully borne out. Others said that it couldn't last fifteen rounds but these also took it all back when both boys took their corners at the end of the battle, both looking as if they were ready for more right then.

Lots of people found fault with the decision too. Of course decisions never did satisfy everybody. Neff won the fight, no doubt, on the way he forged the fight and took the offensive almost all the way through. Most people seemed to think, though, that a draw would have been a better decision and some thought that Anderson should have been named winner. Admitted that Anderson is the more skilful of the two, and he probably is, his work was not as affective as Neff's in Wednesday night's battle. Supporters of Anderson are inclined to defend him and say that he was not in condition. No one says he was, but that really cannot be taken into consideration on the merits of a battle. When fighters go into the ring their condition is forgotten and their work in the stated rounds can only be taken as the basis of decision.

Newcastle United may tour Canada this coming season despite contradictory reports, according to Ed. Spencer, secretary of the Dominion of Canada Football Association. A letter has been received in Toronto from Con Jones in England to the effect that the Newcastle United football team would tour Canada if the trip could be managed in six weeks. This word is being acted upon in the east.

The Pacific International baseball magnates have returned to their various homes after the schedule conference at Vancouver satisfied that everything is in shape for the greatest baseball season in the history of the Northwest. All clubs have been posted to a guarantee of \$1,000 that they will finish the season which commences on May 5. The conference was ended in Vancouver last Saturday with a big banquet of baseball men and newspapermen at the Hotel Vancouver. The season will open with Seattle at Vancouver, Yakima at Spokane and Victoria at Tacoma.
