CONVENTION OF LABOR PEOPLE

Governments, Employers and Employees Will Have Conference to Discuss Extension of Laws.

OTTAWA, April 8.—There will be a conference in Ottawa, probably before the end of this month, of representatives of the different provincial governments, labor and employers who will seek to co-ordinate the various provincial laws affecting labor and, at the same time, consider the extension of the provisions of the Industrial Disputes Act.

This announcement was made by Senator Robertson, minister of labor, in introducing amendments to the act, which provides for arbitration in the case of disputes between the employers and employees in public utilities. Senator Robertson stated that he proposed the conference in accordance with the action taken at the industrial conference last year.

The question of extending the Lemieux Act to cover private industries, which could not be classed as public utilities, will also be reconsidered and the provincial governments will be asked to take steps themselves to bring such provisions into force or allow the Lemieux Act to be extended. This would guarantee a square deal for every man employed whether in public utilities or not.

JURISDICTION OF COMMERCE BOARD IS CHALLENGED

Retail Merchants, Canadian Manufacturers and Alberta Attorney General Question.

OTTAWA, April 8.—Argument has been granted by the Supreme Court on the application to test the jurisdiction of the Board of Commerce and the constitutionality of Section 17 of the Combines and Fair Prices Act, under which the Board of Commerce is given powers of as a price-fixing tribunal. The hearing will take place in the Supreme Court on May 4 next.

Application was brought on March 15 by counsel for the Retail Merchants Association and the Canadian Manufacturers' Association, Attorney General of Alberta and others questioning the legality of the act in forbidding the hoarding of commodities, in appointing the Board of Commerce to impose penalties for offences against the act and require provincial courts to decide them, in giving the board power to decide on unfair profits in purely provincial transactions and in prohibiting the export of commodities from Canada.

When the Supreme Court sat yesterday to read judgments at the end of the term no decision was handed down in this particular case and it is understood that none will be given until after the hearing of the case.

JAPANESE LEGEND IN MOVIE PICTURE

Ned Hamilton, a young Englishman, goes to Japan after being jilted by his fiancée. Income Tax Return

on or before the 30th of April, 1920.

Dominion of Canada



Department of Finance

ALL persons residing in Canada, employed in Canada, or carrying on business in Canada, are liable to a tax on income, as follows:—

1. Every unmarried person, or widow, or widower, without dependants as defined by the Act, who during the calendar year 1919 received or earned \$1,000 or more.

2. All other individuals who during the calendar year 1919 received or earned \$2,000 or more.

3. Every corporation and joint stock company whose profits exceeded \$2,000 during the fiscal year ended in 1919.

Forms to be used in filing returns on or before the 30th of April, 1920.

ALL INDIVIDUALS other than farmers and ranchers must use Form T 1.

FARMERS AND RANCHERS must use Form T 1A.

CORPORATIONS and joint stock companies must use Form T 2.

Penalty

Every person required to make a return, who fails to do so within the time limit, shall be subject to a penalty of Twenty-five per centum of the amount of the tax payable.

Any person, whether taxable, or otherwise, who fails to make a return or provide information duly required according to the provision of the Act, shall be liable on summary conviction to a penalty of \$100 for each day during which the default continues. Also any person making a false statement in any return or in any information required by the Minister, shall be liable, on summary conviction, to a penalty not exceeding \$10,000, or to six months' imprisonment or to both fine and imprisonment.

Read carefully all instructions on Form before filling it in.

Prepay postage on letters and documents forwarded by mail to Inspectors of Taxation.

Make your returns promptly and avoid penalties.
