BRITAIN FEARS NO DIFFICULTY FROM PERSIANS

Negotiations With Soviet Russia by Persia Not Believed to be Against Interests.

LONDON, April 8 .- British official circles declare themselves not alarined at the reports that the Persian Government manifested willingness to conclude an understanding with the Russian Soviet Government which in some questions was interpreted as meaning that such negotiations might be a preface to military action which would menace British interests in Persia. The British view is that the contemplated negotiations would pertain only to economic matters leading to an agreement similar to those already concluded or in process of execution between Soviet Russia and some of the European governments.

It is recailed that the Lenine government, some time ago, approached Persia offering to cancel all treaties and appoint consuls favorable to Persian matters. It is believed that the latest developments are merely manifestations of the Persians' willingness to accept the Russian offer.
