DOLLY VARDEN RAILWAY ACT

Matter for Courts if Chicago Interests Think They Have Complaint, Says Minister.

The Department of Justice at Ottawa has decided not to disallow the Dolly Varden legislation which gave the famous mine and railway to the Taylor Engineering Co. The position which Ottawa takes is that if the Dolly Varden Co., of Chicago, have any complaints to make that it is open for them to take them to the courts for settlement. It is not desirable that the government should assume the functions of a court of justice in debateable questions," states the minister of Justice.
