BOARD OF TRADE ISSUE BOOKLET

Draws Attention to Natural Resources and Possibilities of Prince Rupert District.

A descriptive and illustrated Index and Guide of Prince Rupert and district published by F. S. Wright under the auspices of the Prince Rupert Board of Trade has just made its appearance. The booklet is excellently written and well illustrated and will prove a boon to those who wish to send authentic information to the outside.

The book gives figures on and describes the potential industries of the district including mining, lumbering, fisheries, ship building and agriculture. The desirability of the country as an objective for tourists is also mentioned. On the whole the booklet is a credit both to the Board of Trade and the publisher, and should prove very profitable as an advertising and publicity medium.

Dominion of Canada



Department of Finance

ALL persons residing in Canada, employed in Canada, or carrying on business in Canada, are liable to a tax on income, as follows:—

1. Every unmarried person, or widow, or widower, without dependants as defined by the Act, who during the calendar year 1919 received or earned \$1,000 or more.
2. All other individuals who during the calendar year 1919 received or earned \$2,000 or more.
3. Every corporation and joint stock company whose profits exceeded \$2,000 during the fiscal year ended in 1919.

Forms to be used in filing returns on or before the 30th of April, 1920.

ALL INDIVIDUALS other than farmers and ranchers must use Form T 1.

FARMERS AND RANCHERS must use Form T 1A.

CORPORATIONS and joint stock companies must use Form T 2.

Penalty

Every person required to make a return, who fails to do so within the time limit, shall be subject to a penalty of Twenty-five per centum of the amount of the tax payable.

Any person, whether taxable, or otherwise, who fails to make a return or provide information duly required according to the provision of the Act, shall be liable on summary conviction to a penalty of \$100 for each day during which the default continues. Also any person making a false statement in any return or in any information required by the Minister, shall be liable, on summary conviction, to a penalty not exceeding \$10,000, or to six months' imprisonment or to both fine and imprisonment.

General Instructions.

Obtain Forms from the Inspectors or Assistant Inspectors of Taxation or from Postmasters.

Read carefully all instructions on Form before filling it in.

Prepay postage on letters and documents forwarded by mail to Inspectors of Taxation.

Make your returns promptly and avoid penalties.

PENSIONS FOR NEEDY MOTHERS

Aid Provided for Those with Children to be Granted by Province

The Bill providing for pensions to mothers which is a Government measure before the Legislature provides for aid for indigent mothers up to \$42.50 a month where there is one child under sixteen years of age and an additional \$7.50 for each other child.

In discussing the bill on its second reading, Hon. J. D. McLean, who is in charge of it, pointed to the consensus of opinion among social workers that the hitherto accepted institutional methods of caring for neglected and dependent children is not desirable, but rather must the child be permitted to have the care of its mother. He referred to the difficult position a widow with a family finds herself in in facing the world following the death of the breadwinner. She could either send her children to an institution while she herself went into the labor market to earn a living, she could give her children away by permitting them to be adopted, or she might resort to doubtful methods of gaining a livelihood for herself and them. It was in the interests of the state that a mother so situated should be permitted to retain her control over her family and bring them up in a manner that would make of them future respectable citizens.
