

#### LANDS AND LOANS TO RETURNED SOLDIERS

OTTAWA, April 19.—Up to April 3, the Soldiers Settlement Board of Canada has issued soldier; grant entries to 6,396 returned men. A soldier grant entry comprises 160 acres of free Dominion lands, but these beneficiaries are entitled to a homestead of 160 acres as well as the soldier grant.

Approximately one half of the number who have taken up soldier grant entries have also taken up homesteads, which means an aggregate of well over one and a half million acres of free lands granted to returned soldiers. These settlers are entitled to loans amounting to a maximum of \$3,-000 for equipment and improvements.
