MOTHERS! D'ANNUNZIO IS AGAIN TO FORE

Arrange Spectacular method of Urging Cause Before Premiers.

Fiume, April 29.—Gabrielle D'Annunzio's "foreign office" has given to the Associated Press the text of a message, which will be dropped from an aeroplane on the next Council of Premiers.

D'Annunzio planned to shower the San Remo conference, but did not start soon enough. The message reads: "The League of Fiume—coalition of peoples oppressed and wronged by Anglo-Saxon hegemony by the Pseudo League of Nations and by the Peace Conference—has been constituted."
