A number of the largest bakeries have a limited supply of bread, which will be available in stores, or at bakeries, but none of the bakers will make regular de- crued interest. Approximately 170 bakers in the city are out and the master bakers are working at the ovens, assisted by helpers, and in this way they hope to maintain a partial supply of bread for the restaurants and hotels and public institutions, with perhaps partial supply for regular customers.

The men demand \$39 as a minimum weekly wage for bench hands which the employers refused.
