FIRST BOAT BUILT AT ICELANDIC TOWN

The Iceland, Owned by A. and K. Eyolfson, Built by J. Laruson, Makes Maiden Trip.

J. T. C. Williams, inspector of fisheries for the Dominion Government in Northern British Columbia, District No. 2, who has been on leave of absence for the past four months, returning to the city on Saturday morning, will visit all the big salmon centres to complete arrangements made during the winter for the protection and conservation of the valuable northern salmon fisheries.

For this purpose the fleet of patrol boats has been considerably augmented, says the Vancouver Province. The steamship Crosby, built for Methodist missionary work in British Columbia waters and a familiar sight up and down the coast for the past six years or more, is to be acquired by the Dominion fisheries department. The deal is not yet completed but it is understood the purchase price will be in the neighborhood of \$25,000. She is now in drydock undergoing a thorough overhauling preparatory to being taken over by the government. She is 90 feet long, 20 feet beam, and is equipped with Scotch marine boilers and powerful engines. She is ranked by all who know her as a first-class sea boat. The fleet in northern waters will also be greatly increased by motor launches.

Owing to the open fishing policy adopted by the department this season, new fishery regulations have been enacted, and these, together with the existing laws, will be rigidly enforced for the purpose of conserving the salmon fisheries in the north.

Mr. Williams has been in the service of the department in the northern district for twenty-seven years, and it is confidently expected that his long experience will enable him to successfully cope with the exigencies of the situation.

If climatic conditions are favorable a good run of varieties of salmon is anticipated by the inspector, as the principal spawning grounds were well seeded four years ago. During the time Mr. Williams has been inspector of fisheries for this large district the conservation of salmon has been kept constantly in view, with the gratifying result that as a whole the packs and catches of all varieties have increased both in quantity and value.
