A meeting will be called at an early date to elect officers of the Prince Rupert Swimming Club. Several thousand dollars have already been expended at the Salt Lakes in improvements and conveniences for swimmers. SMITHERS

William Goheen, father of Wm. Goheen, of Smithers, dropped dead while pumping a hand car with the section gang near Telkwa last Tuesday morning.

Dan Quinliven has been appointed superintendent at the Bonanza mine in succession to George McBean who has gone to Hazelton to work on his own property.

A new sawmill with a 10,000 foot daily capacity is being built at Telkwa by Mr. Van Horne on the T. J. Belknap farm.

Development work is to be renewed on the Cascade Group this season under L. E. Le Blanc, of Seattle, J. S. Brown, of Prince Rupert, and Alex S. Miller, of Smithers, the owners.

The cookhouse at the mill of the Smithers Lumber Co. was destroyed by fire last week. Nothing was saved of the provisions and kitchen equipment.

Rev. J. S. Brayfield, of Jamestown, North Dakota, is coming to this district to take up the Anglican Church field work between Telkwa and Houston.

H. C. Davies, M. D., of Stewart has been appointed by the Provincial Government to be medical health officer and medical inspector of schools for Stewart.

TERRACE

It has been decided by the Terrace Board of Trade to publish a pamphlet advertising the advantages of this district at once. The committee appointed to get data for the publication consists of E. E. Chandler, L. H. Kenny and D. McGregor and the president and the secretary of the Board of Trade.

A committee consisting of L. H. Kenny, E. E. Chandler and B. O. Andrews has been named by the Board of Trade to make arrangements for a Victoria Day Celebration here. This committee will also endeavor to make arrangements with the G.T.P. to run a special train from Prince Rupert for the event.

Mr. Buchanan, representing New York and Boston capital, is in town this week to thoroughly investigate mining possibilities in this district. Owing to the big demand for silver and lead and the fact that the Terrace district has much of this class of ore, a number of mining men are expected to visit here this summer.

A very commendable improvement was made to the appearance of the town last week when the citizens turned out and cleared off the right of way from the main street east to the station. This has now been plowed and will be planted in clover, so that the unsightly array of stumps that formerly greeted each arrival on the trains will be a thing of the past.

A provincial police officer will arrive here this week to remain permanently stationed at this point.

A meeting of those interested in the horseshoe drainage project was held in Progress Hall Friday evening when it was decided to authorize the commissioners to proceed with the work according to the provisions of the Act.
