

### RED COATS HAD BRIGHT AFFAIR

Scored One of Season's Social Successes in First Ball at St. Andrew's Last Night.

Scoring one of the social triumphs of the season, the officers, non-commissioned officers and men of the Prince Rupert detachment, Royal Canadian Mounted Police, gave their first ball last evening in the St. Andrew's Hall and established a record that will be difficult to excel.

The crowd was select and congenial and from the opening waltz to the final dance, a spirit pervaded the affair that could have meant nothing else but success. Gray's Orchestra played with an effect that was in keeping with the rest of the affair and was, as usual, generous with encores, which were taken full advantage of.

The committees responsible for the successful event were headed by Captain A. E. Acland, O. C., who also acted as master of ceremonies in genial manner.

### MAY DAY AT GLASGOW WAS A BIG AFFAIR

Resolution Passed Asking for Co-operative Commonwealth in Great Britain.

LONDON, May 3.—The May Day celebration at Glasgow was on an unprecedented scale. A demonstration was held at Glasgow Green at which a crowd of 40,000 persons attended.

PARIS, May 3.—The strike of the railwaymen for nationalization of the railways, which is to be joined by the miners and dockmen, has resulted thus far in hindering traffic only on four of the five big systems.

VANCOUVER, May 3.—The Vancouver May Day labor celebration was the first in the history of the city. Thousands attended a picnic in North Vancouver at which speeches were delivered by F. J. Dixon, M. P. P. of Winnipeg, and other labor leaders.

### SCHOOL ATTENDANCE

Higher Average Than Usual for Month of April.

The total number of pupils attending the public schools in the city, exclusive of the high school and Catholic schools, was during the month of April 612. The average daily attendance for the month was 573.55 and the attendance percentage works out at 93.7. This is the highest percentage since last year. In January it was 92 and in March 90.6.
