Chief Vickers' Resignation Withdrawn This Morning

Unanimous Request of Commissioners that he should not relinquish Charge of Local Police Force

On the request of the Police Commission this morning Chief. W. H. Vickers has withdrawn his resignation as the head of the orce. The motion asking the withdrawal was made by Commissioner Hill who stated that he was fully satisfied with the conduct of the chief and his management of the force.

Commissioner Myhill-Jones, in seconding the motion, stated certain stock in trade is to be the society. that the only criticism he had to offer was that the chief was deducted from the \$500 award. too free and easy and too much of a "good fellow." He would require that the chief be a little stricter in his dealings both with his officers and with the public generally. "There is not a straighter man in this city than Chief Vickers," concluded the commissioner.

The remarks of the mayor were along the same lines as those of Commissioner Myhill-Jones. The mayor urged that the police work be carried on upon more metropolitan lines, in which permal friendship did not enter.
