**GREAT BRITAIN AGAIN TRADING WITH GERMANY**

PARIS, May 9.—Great Britain has stolen a march on the United States and France in resumption of business relations with Germany, say French merchants.

The British are expecting great quantities of raw material. Germany is asking no money but taking manufactured articles in exchange.

**WHEAT PRICES TAKE ANOTHER BIG JUMP**

Advance 35c a Bushel in Middle West and 40c on Both Coasts.

WINNIPEG, May 10.—The new regulations of the Canadian Wheat Board effective May 8 have advanced wheat prices generally. All grades of western wheat advance 35c in central Canada and in Ontario, Quebec and British Columbia, 40c. Another regulation effective at the same time increases the wholesale prices of bran and shorts to the extent of \$3 a ton.

**FORM JEWISH REPUBLIC IN PALESTINE**

Such is Aim of Zionists—Four Million Going There Soon.

LONDON, May 7.—Four million Jews, according to Dr. Max Nordau, the famous essayist and Zionist leader, are now only waiting for the British mandate for Palestine to become effective before they emigrate there. Dr. Nordau declared that in his opinion the mandate would begin within a few weeks. "We are waiting for the British to open the frontiers," Dr. Nordau said today.

"The first settlers," he said, "will be employed in building houses and ploughing the land. To four million Jews, the program for the torn countries of Palestine offers the only hope for a settlement there. It is a matter of life or death to them that the Arab population of Palestine, numbering about half a million, should be either friendly or indifferent to us. We have no fear regarding our future relations with them."

**Want Civil Rule.**

"The immediate need is the replacement of the present military rule by a British civil administration which would throw open the frontiers. It is possible there would be enough Jews to give us a small majority over the Arabs, or at least an equality. We hope that in ten years there will be nearly five million Jews settled there."

"Five thousand wealthy Jews have already signified their desire to remove to Palestine and I am informed that the Oriental American society, recently formed in New York, will invest \$150,000,000 for the purpose of establishing economic relations between America and Palestine. This is not charity, it is business. Ultimately we hope to have a Jewish republic established on the broadest and most democratic lines."
