Building Inspector and Sanitary Inspector Amalgamation Given Negative Report.

SANITATION MAN REPORTS TO COUNCIL

After much discussion at last night's council meeting it was decided to adopt a report of the board of works recommending that the two offices of building inspector and sanitary inspector be maintained separately and distinctly. It was maintained in the report of the city engineer that the building inspector had 31 buildings under construction to look after as well as the examination of the streets and the building of the Morse Creek bridge, if the decision was made to proceed with this. If properly carried out the duties of the sanitary inspector would take all of one man's time.

The question arose as to whether the sanitary inspector had been receiving instructions and giving reports to the city engineer or the health committee. It seems that he had considered himself under the engineer and had been acting accordingly. Various criticism of the manner in which this had been going on in connection with the sanitary inspector's office was voiced and it was finally decided that the sanitary inspector be required to make weekly and monthly reports to the health committee and also that the misunderstanding as to his being responsible to the city engineer be cleared up.

Ald. Casey also urged that the medical health officer be required to make his reports which has not been done of late.

ARREST OVER DRUNKEN ROW

Denkichi Suzuki Alleged to Have Hit Countryman With Saw and Cut Face.

As the result of a drunken row at Inverness on Sunday night, Denkichi Suzuki, Japanese, was arrested by the Provincial Police yesterday charged with assault and bodily injury on a countryman, Fujiero Yoshida. It is alleged that the accused struck the injured man on the head and neck with a saw and cut him up pretty badly.

The matter was reported to the provincial police and the new boat Myfawn was used in the investigation and making of the arrest.

Preliminary hearing of Suzuki is set for 10 o'clock tomorrow morning before Stipendiary Magistrate McMullin.

MISS GRANT PASSES UNIVERSITY EXAMS.

Name Did Not Appear in List Because of Technicality.

Last night word arrived from the University of British Columbia of the successful passing of another Prince Rupert student, Miss Kathleen Grant's name did not appear in the regular pass list of students owing to a supplemental examination which she still holds from first year arts. Miss Grant will have an opportunity of writing this examination in September and, upon passing this, will have full undergraduate standing in the third year. This supplemental examination only gives the student conditional rank which accounts for the non-appearance of Miss Grant's name in the first bare pass list.

This means now that all the Prince Rupert students have made an excellent and most creditable showing.
