NELSON, B. C., May 13 .- Agreeing with the view of Mr. Justice Morrison that it was a wonder Seto Ginn Kee, an inhuman father, was not killed years before, a jury here acquitted Seto Fong of the charge of manslaughter.

Seto Ginn Kee was a logger, and among his practices in dealing with his boy was tying to a tree in winter and deluging him with water, and afterwards forcing filth down his throat.
