How Much is National Debt?

How much is the national debt of Canada? We are told that it is three billion dollars, but what does that mean? Does anybody know? To conceive what is meant by a million is difficult. To have a conception of a billion is much more difficult. There is little basis of comparison. All we know is that it is an immense sum and that the people of the country have to pay the interest on it. How great a burden that is we are already beginning to feel in the increased taxes announced in the budget speech of the Minister of Finance.

Poor Man's Budget Announced Yesterday.

The Dominion Government has announced a poor man's budget. It is framed to make the well to do portion of the community pay, while the poor escape. That is the idea conveyed. The only question is as to who is the poor man.

thing else, however. The poor man is usually the man with the family, and under the proposed law the man with the family will pay most, for he will pay on almost everything he buys. Everyone knows that in making purchases the higher priced goods are usually the Low, 9:48 a.m., 1.2 feet. cheapest. It takes almost as much labor to manufacture a cheap suit of clothes as a good one. The main difference is in the material. The Government then is encouraging the purchase of cheap articles which do not wear, which never look well and which in the long run are the more expensive.

Workingmen Will Pay Most Taxes.

How many people in this city are content to buy suits of clothes at less than \$45 a suit? The average wage earner of this city pays almost twice that for his clothes and he would not be seen out in the cheap, less than \$45 clothes that are offered for sale. He will have to pay this tax. He will also pay on his twelve dollar or fifteen dollar shoes and on his wife's dresses. The average workingman will be the one who will make most of the contributions to the national coffer. He may not pay a very large sum on the gold used in connection with household articles, but he will pay on the staples which he considers just as necessary dard, for the 120th Meridian west. to his mode of existence as is the food he eats.

Good Features Of the Proposal.

There are good fetaures about the budget. We must raise a lot of money in order to pay our debts and unless every man in the community is made to feel the burden, there will be no let up on the expenditures. No person minds spending money which someone else has to pay. At election time there is a cry for expenditures in a dozen directions and a howl because some expenditures have not been made. If all the voters are made to pay, they will not be so keen to support every scheme for spending Prince Rupert harbor is slightly money. It is absolutely necessary, if the present system of administration is to continue, that the Government pay its way.

The country must be solvent. The general scheme of making the well-to-do pay and making the poor immune is correct, with limitations. It is necessary, however, to analyze the scheme offered in order to see that it is not so much a poor man's budget as may appear on the surface. this paper today several thou-We must appraise it at its face value.
