### WATER NOTICE USE AND STORAGE

## Sport Briefs

### "Goin' to Terrace?"

From all indications, Terrace is going to have a big quota of visitors from Rupert on Monday. The opportunity of getting away to the country for a real day's holiday, casting off the responsibility of every day work and getting out for a day of real sport in the progressive little strawberry town is proving a great temptation to many. "Goin' to Terrace?" "You bet I am," has seemed to be the most popular conversation the last day or so. The more philosophical say that even if it does rain here, it won't at Terrace, so, all aboard. We'll expect those Terracettes back on the first of July though.

### Fuelless Motor Bicycle.

An appliance which it is said will render a bicycle self propelling without fuel consumption or running expenses of any kind has just been perfected in England. The appliance depends on oil or water under pressure actuating a small water motor geared to the back wheel. The pressure is maintained by the weight of the rider acting on a small pump. The pump takes the place of saddle springs and uses the energy. A cylindrical pump is fitted to the tube holding the saddle pillar and air is pumped into the tank. Immediately beneath the saddle is the pump worked by the weight of the rider when the bicycle is in motion, and oil is drawn from another tank mounted on the rear carrier, and is pumped into the air chamber, so that the air is further compressed through the journey. Control levers and chains further regulate the working of the appliance.

### Victoria Opener.

The opening game of the Pacific International League between Victoria and Vancouver at Victoria on Monday was quite a memorable one. L. A. Smith, flying in Harry Brown's "Pathfinder," threw the ball from the plane when it swooped to the ground. William Sloan, minister of mines, threw the first ball and Mayor Robert J. Porter was behind the bat. A big parade of motor cars took place before the game.

### South African Teams.

South Africa is sending to Europe for the Olympiad a team of eleven athletes, five cyclists, six boxers, two wrestlers and one swimmer. In addition, she is sending a team of nine rifle men. It is hoped that in addition to these the South African representatives will include B. G. Rudd and H. P. Jeppe, whose recent performances in inter-varsity sports have attracted so much attention.

### Motorcycle Record.

What was claimed as the world's record for motorcycles with side car and passenger was hung at San Diego last week when Roy Arley covered 132 miles from Los Angeles to that city in two hours and 26 minutes, cutting previous side car records for the same distance 10 1/2 minutes.


