

Columbia production, the speaker was a little less enthusiastic. He pointed out that China possessed an enormous supply of the raw product and Japan was already in the producing field in a large way. She had her finger on the greater part of the iron ore of the Orient, he had been given to understand when there only a few weeks ago, and he should say that iron manufactured on this side of the Pacific would find the competition very discouraging there. However, the rest of the world was truly a market of unlimited possibilities. Cost £2,000,000.

Based on Old Country conditions, Sir John estimated that two millions sterling would establish a comprehensive plant, including the coking, smelting and steel making phases. It would be established in progressive units so that revenue might be obtained relatively from the beginning of the operations. At that he estimated that five years would be consumed before pig iron could be turned out on a commercial scale and possibly close to ten years before the products of the steel rolling mills would be ready for market on a large scale. It would take time and courage, but at that he thought the world would welcome a development of the sort in British Columbia, providing the conditions were right here for economical production.

CANADIAN NATIONAL TRAIN OVERTURNED

No Loss of Life but Cars Turned Upside Down Alongside Track. Delayed press despatch tells of the overturning of a freight train on the Canadian National line near Onoway last week-end. While no serious personal damage was occasioned as a result of the wreck, it is said that the employee in charge of the freight train, Conductor Pierce, received several bruises and a painful shaking-up when the caboose in which he was riding came to a sudden halt as the derailed cars left the tracks. In addition to the three cars in the ditch, three others also left the rails, the whole of the derailed cars being located in the central portion of the train. Both the fore and rear ends remained intact, however, which fortunately, was the reason for the absence of injury to the crew. Canadian National railway officials in Edmonton were made acquainted with the wreck immediately, a wrecking crew being sent out with all despatch to the scene. It is said that the mishap was occasioned as a result of the cars being too heavily loaded with ties.

WATER NOTICE USE AND STORAGE
