MAY DEVELOP B. C. DEPOSITS

General Watson Suggests New Merger May Benefit This Province.

Brigadier-General Sir David Watson, who with Lady Watson, was in Victoria recently, defends the formation of the gigantic British Empire steel merger, which has been promoted by Col. Grant Morden, M.P., as likely to bring most important results to the whole of the industries of the Dominion. Sir David disclaims any direct financial interest in the merger save as a personal friend of Col. Morden and a director of the Davie Shipbuilding Company, of Levis, Quebec, one of the industrial concerns being absorbed.

"I should be inclined to say that, with such enormous capital as an organization of this character would command, the great potential iron and steel resources of British Columbia might be opened up in a way that should make a remarkable future for Western Canada," said Sir David. "Col. Morden realized," the speaker went on, "that in Great Britain enormous wealth was available. He also appreciated that in Canada were natural resources of tremendous extent awaiting development. I should say that his idea is to bring the British capital to the Dominion resources so as to enable the Canadian manufacturer to compete on something like even terms with such concerns as the United States Steel Corporation."

Sir David went on to say that the merger had at its back something like \$25,000,000 in addition to the enormous assets of the concern which were being absorbed. These, he said, included such important companies as the Nova Scotia Steel Co., the Dominion Iron and Steel Corporation, the Collingwood Shipbuilding Co., the Davie Shipbuilding Co., and a number of other interests. According to the investigations of some of the leading accounting authorities of Canada and Great Britain, there were assets of \$461 behind every dollar of invested capital.

HAZELTON

ALDERMAN PERRY WOULD LIKE SPEED

Inquires Regarding Trail to the Marine Ways, and Other Matters.

At last night's council meeting Alderman Perry inquired regarding progress on the new trail to the Seal Cove Marine Ways and was informed by the mayor that, instead of costing \$75, as W. E. Thompson had at first stated, the work would cost \$300. The mayor is to have the matter further investigated with a view to having the company share the cost.

On inquiring as to the disposition of the Taylor Street grading petition, the mayor told Alderman Perry that there had been no quorum of the board of works so the matter had had to stand.

"It seems that this council is falling into procrastinating ways," said the alderman. "If it my conviction that things are being stayed off and allowed to drift along and drift along. It doesn't look good to me. The city solicitor has been here for five weeks and there is no answer to the Hays' damage claim. I think that too long a time has elapsed and that the delay is not justified. I would like to see more expeditious treatment of matters like this."

Regarding the Hays' claim, the mayor stated that the matter was being delayed with the permission of Mr. Patmore, solicitor for Hays.
