USE AND STORAGE

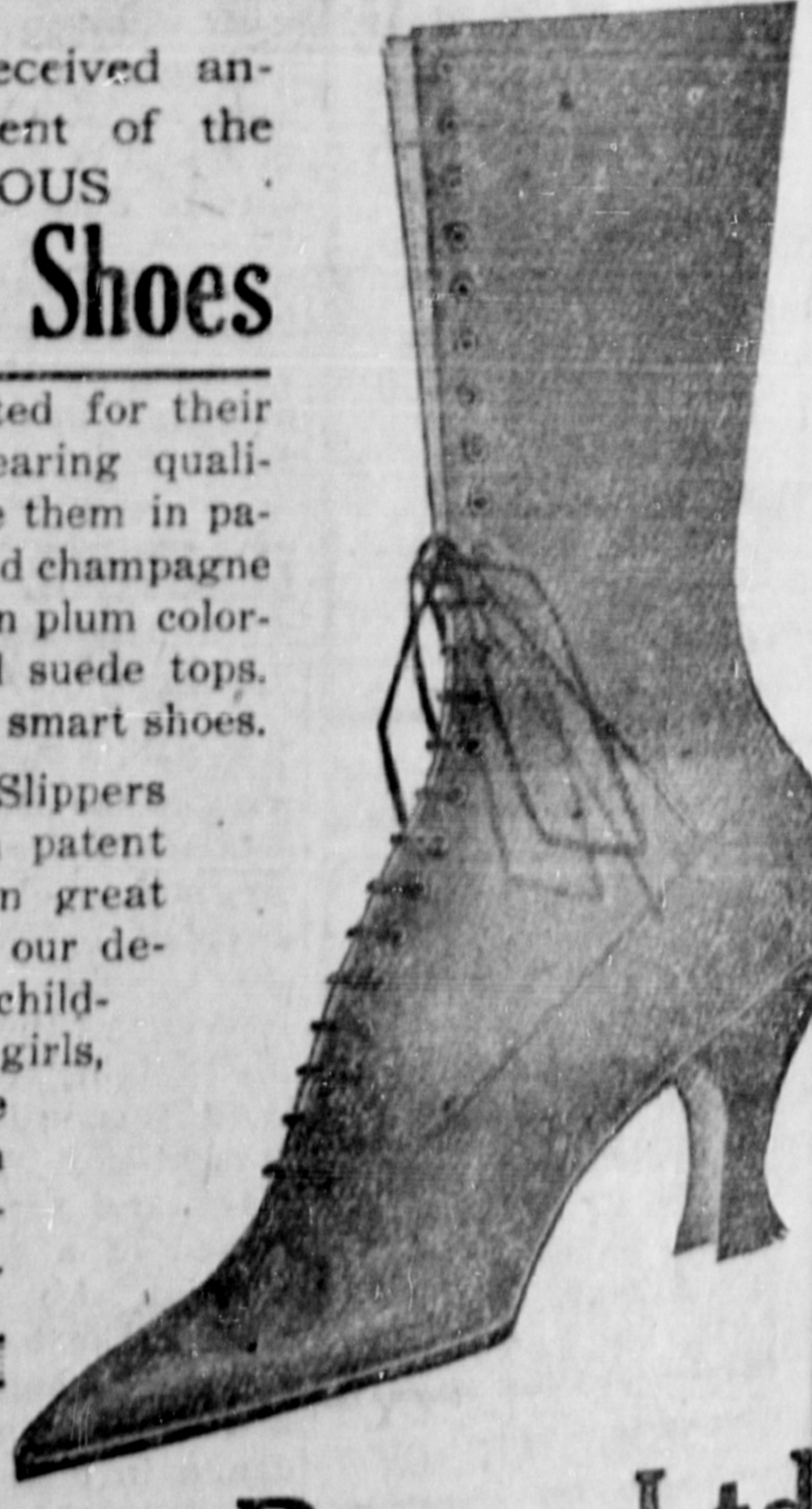
