ATLIN AND BOOTH TAKE FISH TODAY

Two Carloads Going East on Tomorrow's Train—Foster Arrives.

Two carloads of fish were bought at the fish exchange this morning by the Booth and Atlin Fisheries. This will be shipped east tomorrow morning in the only two cars now left in the yards. The George E. Foster arrived during the night with 50,000 pounds for the Canadian Fish and Cold Storage Co.; the Mackereel, a small American troll boat, made her first call at this port this morning and sold 3,000 lbs. of red salmon at 14.1c, and 200 pounds white salmon at 5c to the Canadian Fish and Cold Storage Company.

Carlen, 25,000 pounds to the Booth Fisheries Co. at 13.6c and 6c., also the Koke, 3,000 pounds, and the Red Wing, 300 pounds.



LOCAL MEMBER TELLS WORLD OF DISTRICT

Says Wealth of North Sufficient to Pay National Debt of Province.

VANCOUVER, May 28.—Hon. T. D. Pattullo, minister of lands and member for Prince Rupert in the Legislature, who has just returned here from a visit to his constituency, gives an interview to the newspapers in which he says that the wealth of the north is so great that, if developed, it will pay the national debt of the province.

There are millions of acres of land north of the 54th parallel on which stock can graze all winter. From the Naas River to Kitimat are the richest valleys of the province extending over hundreds of miles. The north country is larger than Germany and is needing only development. Hundreds of settlers are now coming in.

PERMIT FOR NEW SCHOOL

Building Inspector Has Made Issuance to Board of School Trustees

This morning the permit for the new \$150,000 school was issued by the building inspector. The permit is made to the Board of School Trustees and calls for a masonry, brick and concrete building.

Contractor V. Basso-Bert has already started the concrete works, and frames for the basement are beginning to take shape. A road has been built for a few yards into the grounds and truck-loads of material supplies are constantly being unloaded.
