### DELEGATES AT CONVENTION

Alderman Dybhavn and G. W. Nickerson Will Represent Prince Rupert.

#### PARTY EXPECTED IN THE CITY NEXT WEEK

Two delegates left last night to represent Prince Rupert at the convention of the National Fish-eries Association at Vancouver. Ald. John Dybhavn represents the city and G. W. Nickerson represents the Board of Trade. Both of these men are aggressive and well informed on the subject and should voice the views of Prince Rupert with some effect before the big organization.

The Canadian Fish & Cold Storage Co. will be represented by the Vancouver manager of the concern, Mr. St. Denis.

While nothing definite has been received in regard to the plans of the delegates, it is understood that a large party will visit Prince Rupert after the convention. Possibly they will leave Vancouver on Monday, arriving here on Wednesday of next week. They will be entertained by the Board of Trade, co-operating with the officials of the Canadian Fish & Cold Storage Co., and other fishery interests in the city, but just what form the entertainment will take outside of showing the visitors the fishery facilities of the city, is not yet known.

#### DOUBLE SERVICE TO SKAGWAY JUNE 12

VICTORIA, June 1.—The C. P. R. announces that their double service to Skagway calling at Alert Bay, Prince Rupert, Ketchikan and Juneau will commence on June 12. The Princess Alice and Princess Mary will alternate on the run, leaving here every Friday night and Vancouver Saturday night.

#### DANISH COLONY FOR BRITISH COLUMBIA

Quebec, June 1.—A large party of Danish agriculturalists arrived here yesterday en route to the prairies and British Columbia. They have in view the purchase of large tracts of land and establishing a Danish colony.

#### RUSSIAN CAVALRY ENTERED ARMENIA

LONDON, June 1.—Two Russian cavalry regiments crossed the Armenian frontier and Armenia has protested to the Soviet Government against the invasion. New attacks made by the Poles on Kiev were repulsed by the Reds.

#### LUXURY TAX ON BOAT FOR VANCOUVER POLICE

VANCOUVER, June 1.—The city council will have to pay the ten per cent luxury tax on the new police boat ordered which is to cost \$3,900.

transformers at the plant and the company shall negotiate with the G. T. P. for right-of-way. The contract shall be effective for three years and may be extended or closed on six months' notice.

7. All alterations must be approved by the railway company.

8. All appliances and equipment installed shall remain the property of the corporation.

9. All instruments shall be of such quality as the dry dock and railway company approve.

10. The city operations shall not endanger the company plant.

11. Passes shall be issued by the company to the plant for city employees on business in connection therewith.

12. If defective service is given the company must be notified at once, but it will not be liable.

13. If the company ceases business the present contract will terminate, but the city may continue to operate the plant.
