B. C. Canners Association makes Official Announcement; Sockeyes Higher, but Inferior Fish are Lower than Last Year

VANCOUVER; June 2.—The B. C. Canners' Association offi- BUDGET PASSES fixed for raw salmon purchases until August 29. There is a difference of price when caught with cannery gear over that paid for fish caught with private gear. The first price is for cannery gear, the second for private:

Sockeyes and cohoes, 37c. and 55c. per fish.

Red springs caught in the sockeye nets, 3c. and 8c. a pound. Red springs over ten pounds, 90c. and \$1.25 per fish. .

White springs caught in sockeye nets, 25c, and 35c, per fish. White springs caught with spring nets, 2c. per pound.

Pinks, 4c. and 5c. per fish.

## Japanese Control Fisheries of B.C.

White Man has little show in Salmon Fishing, says Colonel Peck before Par'iamentary Commission at Ottawa

OTTAWA, June 2.-That Japanese fishermen are gaining such a strong hold on the salmon fishing in British Columbia that white man has little show, was a statement made yesterday by Colonel C. W. Peck to the Parliamentary Commission on Pensions and Re-establishment, of which he is a member.

The Colonel said that last year 2,177 Japanese were given icenses against 417 native born Canadians. He charged that the Japanese "jigged" naturalization papers back and forth and so overcame the law on naturalization before the licenses were

Peck declared that 50,000 more returned men had gone to British Columbia than the total number which went overseas. from the province.
