Synopsis of Land Act Amendments

Minimum price of first-class land Pre-emption new confined to sur-

Records will be granted covering only land suitable for agricultural purposes and which is non-timber land Partnership pre-emptions abolished. but parties of not more than four may arrange for adjacent pre-emptions with joint residence, but each making seary improvements on respective Pre-emptore must occupy claims for

value of \$10 per acre, including clear-ing and cultivation of at least 5 acres, before receiving Crown Grant. Where pre-emptor in occupation no less than & years, and has made proportionate improvements, he may, be cause of ill-health, or other cause, be granted intermediate certificate of improvement and transfer his claim. Records without permanent residence may be issued, provided appli-

cant makes improvements to extent o \$300 per annum and records same each year. Fallure to make improvements or record same will operate as forfeiture. Title cannot be obtained in less than I years, and improvements of \$10.00 per acre, including 5 acres cleared and cultivated, and residence of at least 2 years are required. Pre-emptor holding Crown grant may record another pre-emption, if he

requires land in conjunction with his farm, without actual occupation, provided statutory improvements made and residence maintained on Crown granted land. Unsurveyed areas, not exceeding 20 acres, may be leased as homesites; title to be obtained after fulfilling residential and improvement conditions.

For grasing and industrial purposes areas exceeding 640 acres may be leased by one person or company Mill, factory or industrial sites on timber land not exceeding 40 acres may be purchased; conditions include payment of stumpage. Natural hay meadows inaccessible by existing roads may be purchased conditional upon construction of a road to them. Rebate of one-half of cost of

price, is made.

PRE-EMPTORS' FREE GRANTS The scope of this Act is enlarged to include all persons joining and serving with His Majesty's Forces. The time within which the heirs or devisees of a deceased pre-emptor may apply for title under this Act is extended from for one year from the death of such person, as formerly, until one year after the conclusion of the present war. This privilege is also made re-

troactive.

No fees relating to pre-emptions are due or payable by soldiers on pre-emptions recorded after June 26, 1918.

Taxes are remitted for five years.

Provision for return of moneys account due and been paid since August 4, 1914, on account of payments, fees are taxes on soldiers pre-emptions. Interest on agreements to purchase town or city lots held by members of Allied Forces, or dependents, acquired direct or indirect, remitted from enlistment to March 21, 1920.

SUB-PURCHASERS OF CROWN Provision made for issuance of Crown grants to sub-purchasers of Crown Lands, acquiring rights from purchasers who failed to complete purchase, involving forfeiture, on ful-filment of conditions of purchase, interest and taxes. Where sub-purchasers do not claim whole of original parcel, purchase price due and taxes. cel, purchase price due and taxes may



The commercial effect of the war and its cessation is strikingly exemplified in the whale fisheries of the Pacific coast. Due to the food shortage and the deand for oils and fats, whale fishing was actively carried on. During the 1918 season, over 500 whales were taken by three fishing stations; the catch of one station done was 246. During the same year 30,000 cases of whale meat was canned and met a ready mar-

The close of the war, however, neant the complete cessation of the whale-canning industry; no whale meat was put up in 1919,

and but 166 whales were taken. Whale meat is a nutritious food product, in taste being similar to beefsteak. It was placed on the market at a price of 20 cents per 43 pound tin and filled a requirement for food supply at low cost. As a war measure the taking of 500 whales in one season could would result in the annihilation of this great mammal.
