

ANTI-CANADIAN SHIPPING LAW IS SUSPENDED

Held over for Three Months by
Inter State Commerce
Commission.

VANCOUVER, June 24.—Prince Rupert is vitally interested in the intimation just received from Washington that the Interstate Commerce Commission has suspended for 90 days Clause 30 of the Merchant Marine Act, which provided, according to the Jones bill introduced by Senator Jones of the State of Washington:

That all freight destined for foreign ports or domestic coast ports are to be granted a substantial differential in freight rates against such shipments destined to be carried in foreign bottoms.

Prince Rupert is also directly concerned with Clause 29 of the bill as it now stands.
