Medical Missionary Tells of Effect of Recent Movement.

VICTORIA, June 21 .- That the boycott imposed by the Chinese through hatred of the Japanese is proving a good move for China is the statement of E. J. Dickson. medical missionary, who passed through here on the Empress of Japan. He pointed out that as the result of Chinese business men refusing to handle Japanese merchandise Chinese were manufacturing the barred goods themselves. He did not believe it would be necessary for the Chinlese Government to take any steps to protect these new industries, as the masses would do this themselves. It is only in a very few instances that the boycott has shown any signs of slipping, he said. This is the most successful boycott ever imposed by China

ave years and make improvements to value of \$10 per acre, including clear-ing and cultivation of at least 5 acres. before receiving Crown Grant. Where pre-emptor in occupation not less than 3 years, and has made proportionate improvements, he may, because of ill-health, or other cause, be granted intermediate certificate of improvement and transfer his claim. Records without permanent resi-

dence may be issued, provided applicant makes improvements to extent of \$300 per annum and records same each year. Failure to make improvements or record same will operate as forfeiture. Title cannot be obtained in less than 5 years, and improvements of \$10.00 per acre, including 5 acres cleared and cultivated, and residence of at least 2 years are required.

Pre-emptor holding Crown grant may record another pre-emption, if he requires land in conjunction with his farm, without actual occupation, provided statutory improvements made and residence maintained on Crown granted land. Unsurveyed areas, not exceeding 20 acres, may be leased as homesites;
