A Real Mining District Is Back of Alice Arm

Five Locomotives and Twenty Cars carry Ore from Dolly Varden and other Mines on Kitsault River

Despite several setbacks in the form of strikes and also suffering from the disadvantage of a season that is rather late in opening this year, mining activity at Alice Arm has commenced to manifest itself and this season should prove a busy one at the northern silver camp. The snow has just recently left the ground in the vicinity of the Dolly Varden mine and still may be seen in patches along the upper end of the railway. The Taylor Mining Company is getting nicely started shipping ore and the railway has been running about three weeks. Here and there have been a few slight mishaps in operation but soon the rough spots will be cleared and things will be running smoothly after the winter, during which the road has been idle.

The old 30 pound steel rails are being replaced with 56 pound steel, but on account of the scarcity of steel it will be impossible to change the whole line this year. The work of changing between the dock and the town station is now done and the rails on the 5 per cent grade a few miles below the mine will be changed next. The heavier rails will make the hauling of the trains much easier and safer.

Railway Extension

Work on the extension of the Dolly Varden Railway from the Dolly compressor and tramway at Camp 8 has commenced and the first half mile of station contract work has been let to Mr. Archibell. It is expected that the Wolf extension, consisting of two miles of difficult rock work in the canyon of the Kitsault River which will also have to be bridged, will be completed this year and ready for operation before the season closes.

The Taylor Mining Co. is living fully up to its policy of progress that was outlined by A. J. T. Taylor, its head, in an interview with the Daily News early this spring. Twenty 20-ton ore cars arrived recently on a barge in tow of the tug Spray of Victoria and have already been commissioned hauling high grade ore from the mine to the beach. The two new locomotives, 35 ton and 45 ton, Baldwin and Mogul machines, are now on the way North. With their arrival the Dolly Varden road will be well equipped with 5 locomotives and about 40 cars, sufficient to haul about 500 tons of ore a day.

Bunker Nearly Ready

The ore bunkers at the beach are nearing completion and will facilitate greatly the transfer of ore from the mine railway to barges for transfer to the smelter. The installation of the ore bunkers will change the wharfage appearance at the Arm very considerably. The largest amount of ore to come down the Dolly Varden Railway this season came down on Wednesday, when two trains brought down 160 tons. On Monday one train brought down 90 tons. The ore now coming down is taken directly from the mine and comes right down the tram into the ore cars. The ore that has been mined during the
