TROOPS' CONDITION CONSIDERED EXCELLENT

New York, July 10.—The con-
dition of the allied troops along
the western battlefront was de-
scribed as excellent by Dr. G.
Sterling Ryerson, president of the
Canadian Red Cross, and surgeon-
general of the Canadian forces,
who reached here yesterday on
the steamship Espagne from
Lisavre.

"During my absence I visited
almost the entire battlefront
along the Aisne and the Marne,"
Dr. Ryerson said. "I found the
conditions of the Canadian and
Allied troops excellent, as well as
the spirit of the men."

"Within two months there will
be put under way along the entire
western front a tremendous drive,
which will be the greatest that
this war has seen. General Joffre
recently said that the Germans
would be out of France by the
first of the coming year, and from
what I have seen and heard I have
every reason to believe they will
be. The war will be over in
another year and the Germans
will be defeated."

"The Allied troops have no lack
of equipment, and their general
health is excellent."

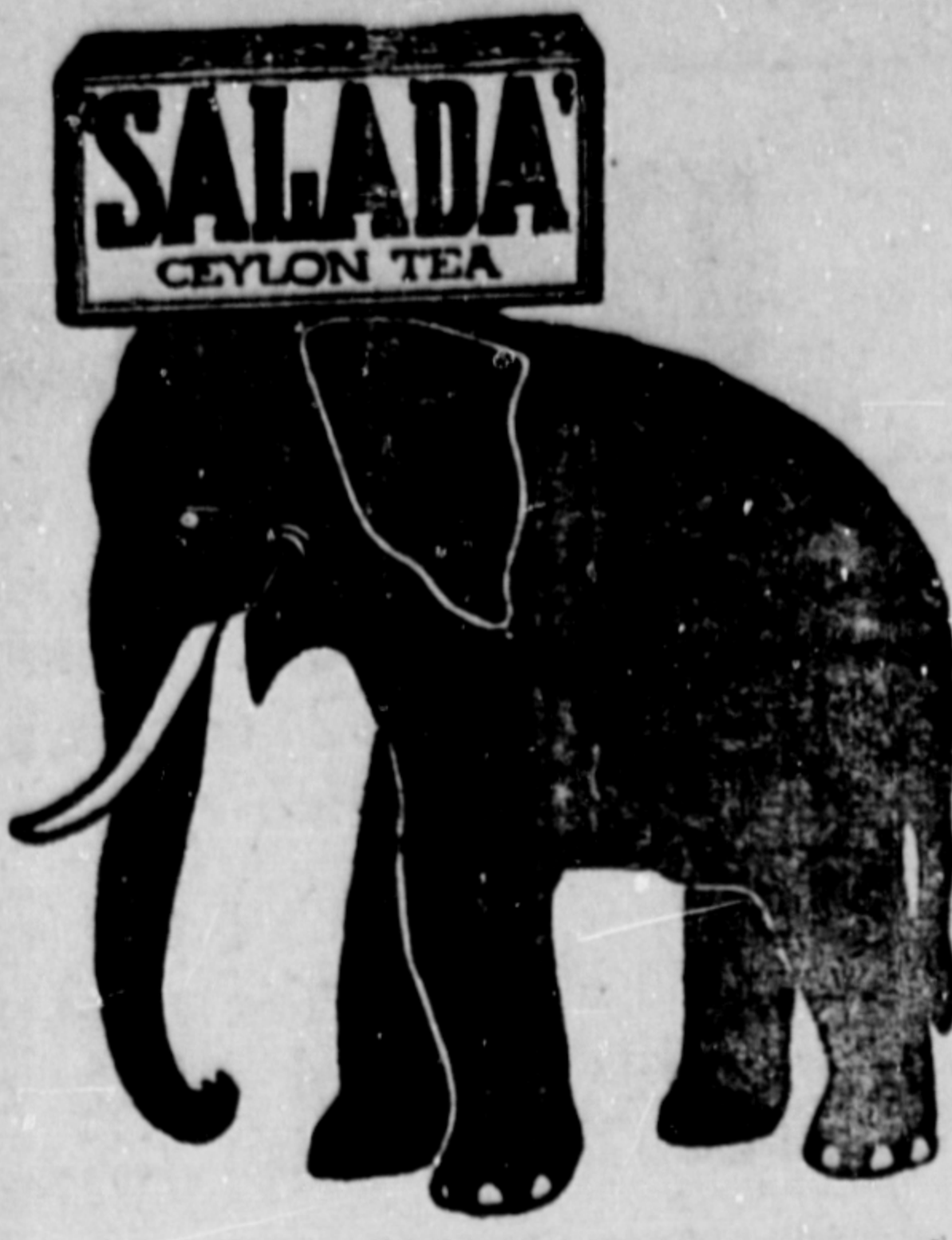

is a scream.

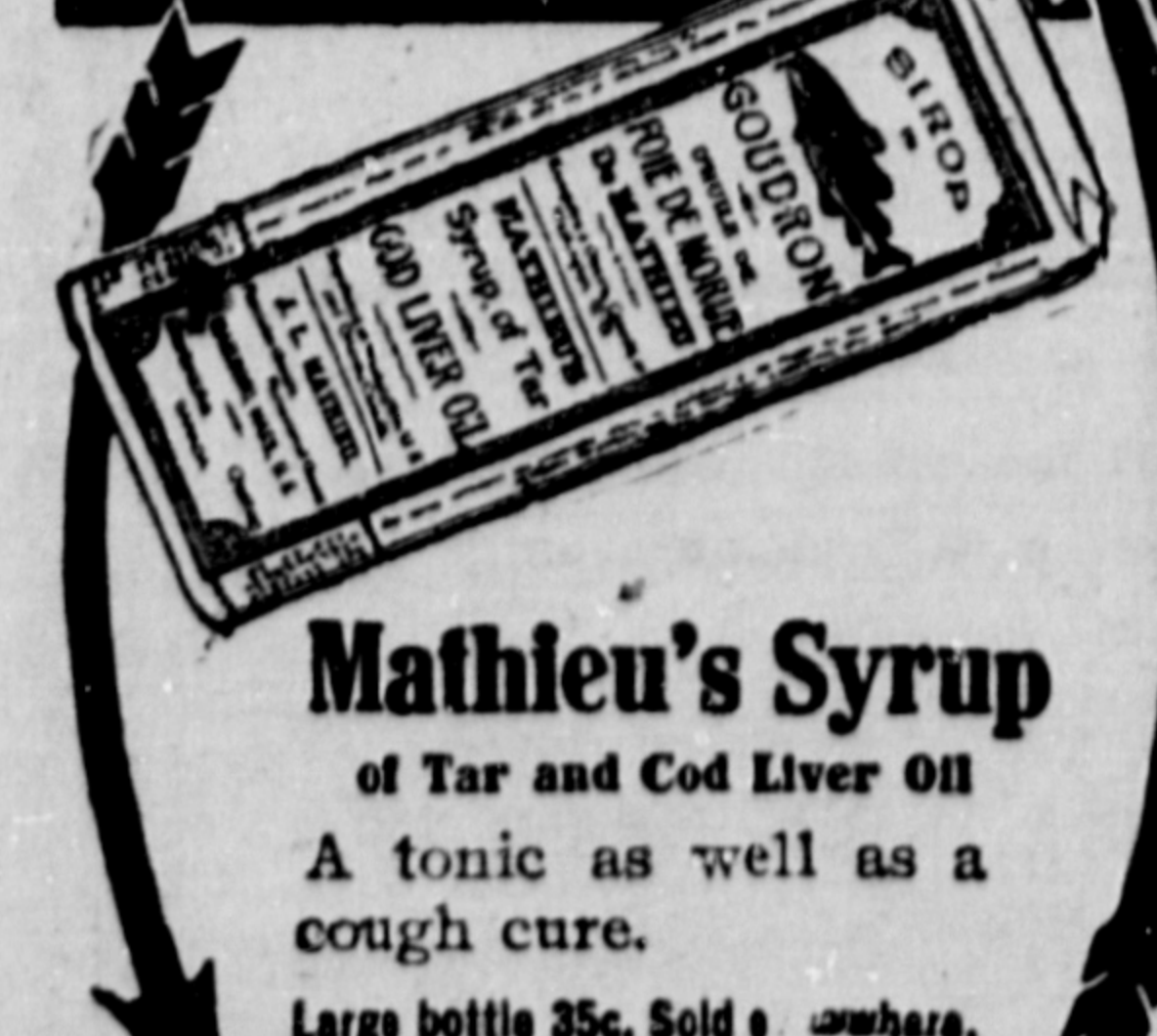
LORD MERSEY'S REPORT ON FALABA DISASTER

London, July 10.—Lord Mersey,

that the failure of the German
submarine to afford to the pas-
sengers an opportunity of taking
to the boats was responsible for
the big loss of life.
