ON LOOKOUT FOR SUSPECTED CRAFT

From the department at Ottawa has come an order to all masters of vessels navigating the coasts of Canada, to keep a lookout for suspicious craft.

"The masters of vessels navigating Canadian waters are warned as to the necessity of keeping a sharp lookout and reporting any suspicious craft they might sight.

"Small fishing and coasting vessels are particularly urged to at once report any such craft to the nearest customs officer for transmission, by telegraph on the east coast, to the captain in charge, Halifax dockyard, and on the west coast to the superintendent, Esquimalt dockyard.

"It is not desired that any hearsay evidence should be forwarded but only definite facts."
