ALD. MONTGOMERY HEARS FROM DE MAYER

Ald. Montgomery has received the following interesting letter from Pte. De Mayer, of the first Prince Rupert contingent. Mr. De Mayer was the gentleman who sang "La Marseillaise" at the memorable smoker in St. Andrews Hall.

Lord Derby War Hospital, Warrington, Lancs., June, 25th.

Dear friend:—Since the last time I wrote you I have had the misfortune to have been wounded rather severely in my left hand. Besides that I was hit in the back of the left shoulder with shrapnel, which, however, was not so severe. We arrived at the front on the 22nd of April and I wanted to visit some of my Belgian friends, who were a mile and a quarter away from our trenches. As I made my way there I found myself in the French trenches and was arrested as a suspicious person and they kept me under arrest for three days and as they could not find anything wrong with me they handed me over to the British headquarters where finally I was court martialled, found not guilty, and sent back to my company. Later on, about the middle of May, our company was ordered to make an attack in the North of France, at La Basse, but, dear friend, that picture I never will forget, as it was raining for days and we were drenched through. We made the attack about three in the afternoon under a perfect shower of shrapnel, shells and bullets, but in spite of this we went straight for the German trenches and this was where quite a number of our men, including myself, got hit. When I was hit, Sergt. Bob Cameron, formerly jeweler, 2nd Ave., my platoon sergeant, was close to my side, and told me to back out of the firing line. This was a terrible hole to get out of as I was a target for over two miles. I learned since that Major Peck was hurt in that battle, as also were many others. By my address you will see that I am safe in England. Besides myself there is also another member of my platoon here, that is Albert Allet, of Prince Rupert.

I hope you will remember me to all my friends and your family. If you wish to write back to me, please send it to Canadian Headquarters, London.

TRADE LICENCES

NOTICE

Pursuant to Bylaw 255 governing above, also resolution of Council dated July 12th. All licences are due and payable on July 15th, 1915, and must be paid forthwith.

Section 33 of this Bylaw provides the following: "Any person guilty of a breach of this bylaw, or who carries on any profession, trade, occupation or calling, for which a licence or tax is provided for in this bylaw, without having first taken out such licence and having paid the licence fee or tax herein provided, shall be liable, on summary conviction, to a penalty of twenty-five dollars (\$25.00) together with the amount of the licence fee or tax, which should have been paid, and in default of payment, to imprisonment for sixty (60) days."

The Bylaw also declares: "It shall be the duty of every person or company holding a licence under this bylaw to exhibit such licence at all times in a conspicuous place in his office or place of business, so that the same may be seen by the officials of the city and any person doing business with them."

I respectfully ask all persons coming under these regulations to pay licences at once.
